Down the Ways: The Wooden Ship Era Walking Tour

Sunday, April 10, 1:00 p.m.

Guided tour with historian Beverly Tyler explores the history of shipbuilding in Setauket, NY. This tour will be conducted at low tide so that the bones of the schooners will be uncovered in Scott's Cove. This Three Village Historical Society walking tour is designed for students, families and adults. Please arrive 5 minutes prior to the start time listed to ensure a prompt start. Tour lasts approximately one and one half hours. Fee: \$3 for members, \$5 for non-members. No reservations are necessary.

Location: Tours leave from the Setauket Dock, Shore Road, East Setauket

Setauket Village Green Walking Tour

Saturday, April 16, 10:30 a.m.

Discover Setauket's rich history as you explore its architecture and beautiful natural environment. Take a peek into the past as you walk by 17th and 18th century homes of the early residents of Suffolk County and the 19th century homes of area sea captains. Visit the cemetery where the leader of the Setauket Spy Ring is buried, near the resting place of the artist William Sidney Mount. This Three Village Historical Society walking tour is designed for students, families and adults. Tour lasts approximately one hour and fifteen minutes. Fee: \$3 for Society members, \$5 for non-members. No reservations are necessary.

Location: Tours leave from the Setauket Neighborhood House, 95 Main Street, in Setauket, NY across from the Mill Pond.

Walk Through History with Farmer and Revolutionary War Spy Abraham Woodhull

Saturday, April 16, 2:00 p.m.

Abraham Woodhull, portrayed by historian Beverly Tyler, leads tour-goers on a walk through the nature sanctuary that was once Woodhull's farm. Tour-goers are introduced to the woods, fields, ponds and bays that tell the story of Long Island's colonization and settlement preceding the Revolution and the creation of the new nation. Participants on the tour will learn how Benjamin Tallmadge, head of General Washington's Secret Service, set up an undercover message system and will see copies of maps and spy letters. This Three Village Historical Society walking tour is designed for students, families and adults. Tour lasts approximately one and one half hours. Fee: \$3 for Society members, \$5 for non-members. No reservations are necessary. Location: Tours leave from the Caroline Church parking lot at the Carriage Shed along Dyke Road at the Setauket Village Green.
